



Creating a Lasting Legacy

Making a legacy gift in your will or trust is one of the easiest and most popular ways to partner in the mission. No matter your income, a will effectively directs the dispersal of your estate as you wish.

Here are the most common ways that people make a lasting gift to KidVantage:

Specific bequest

Direct a specific bequest of money or an asset (e.g. stock, a house, collections) to KidVantage

or

Designate a percentage of the total value of the estate.

Residual bequest

Designate a residual bequest that directs KidVantage to receive the remainder of the estate, or a portion of the remainder, after all expenses and other bequests have been made

Contingent bequest

A gift that is originally intended for other beneficiaries but, in the event of their prior passing, is redirected as a charitable donation.

Getting Started

Meet with your tax advisor and lawyer to determine which planned gift strategy is best for you.
